The proposed transfers of Joseph's 50% interest in Licensee to Joseph's Trust and of Mary Ann's 50% interest to Mary Ann's Trust do not constitute material changes in ownership. Because each of these Trusts are revocable, they do not have a separate identity or a separate Federal Employer Identification Number and do not file tax returns. Joseph is the beneficiary and remains in control of his Trust and Mary Ann is the beneficiary and remains in control of her Trust. Joseph and Mary Ann are the trustees of each Trust. Because of the foregoing, there is no (a) purchase agreement, (b) exchange of funds, (c) financial records for the transactions or (d) financial implications.

I ask that you kindly place this matter on the agenda for the first available meeting.

SUBJ.: 15-Year Capital Plan Overview and Next Steps

This memorandum provides an overview of the **15-Year Capital Plan**, developed to guide the Town's long-term investments in infrastructure, equipment, and services. The plan aims to promote fiscal responsibility, transparency, and alignment with community priorities while maintaining and upgrading Town assets.

Background and Objectives

The 15-Year Capital Plan was designed as a long-term strategy to:

- Maintain, upgrade, and replace aging Town assets in a systematic way.
- Reduce unanticipated costs and emergency repairs.
- Support fiscal responsibility and provide clear, transparent budgetary information to the Select Board, Finance Committee, and the public.
- Advance long-term community goals and ensure infrastructure sustainability.

Key Drivers of Capital Needs

The plan responds to several major drivers:

- **Aging Infrastructure:** Regular replacement and modernization of facilities, vehicles, and equipment.
- Safety & Compliance: Projects to meet regulatory standards and ensure public safety.
- **Technology Upgrades:** Investments to modernize service delivery.
- Energy Efficiency & Climate Adaptation: Projects supporting environmental sustainability.

Development Process

The Town Manager established the staff-level **Capital Expenditure Committee**, which has been meeting monthly since June 2025. The capital plan was developed through a collaborative and transparent process, involving key leadership across departments.

Note: Sudbury Public Schools were invited to participate in these meetings; however, there was no representation other than from the Combined Facilities Director.

Process Highlights

- **Departmental Input:** Each department reviewed current and future needs for facilities, vehicles, equipment, Parks & Grounds, and infrastructure.
- Collaborative Review: Monthly meetings were held to refine project scope, timing, costs, and funding sources.
- **Forecasting:** All projected costs were inflation-adjusted to ensure realistic long-term estimates.

Plan Highlights

• 15-Year Forecast:

- o Categorized costs for roads, buildings, vehicles, technology, and equipment.
- o Includes both critical projects (safety, compliance, infrastructure reliability) and long-term investments (efficiency, sustainability).

• 5-Year Capital Plan:

- o Focuses on near-term priorities and capital funding sources.
- o Funding options include Tax Levy, Free Cash, Stabilization Funds, Capital Exclusions, and Debt (within levy or excluded). The particular funding source will be determined at the time of appropriation.

Scope of the Capital Plan

To provide a comprehensive overview of identified needs, the Committee compiled an extensive list of projects in a detailed **attached read only 15-Year Capital Plan spreadsheet**.

- The plan currently includes over 560 projects spanning a 15-year period, with a total projected cost of \$192,648,835.
- Annual capital spending requirements vary significantly, ranging from approximately \$5.7 million to \$34 million per year.
- The read only spreadsheet contains separate sheets for each department, including the Town Manager Departments, LSRHS, SPS Facilities, Town Facilities, Recreation, DPW, Parks & Grounds, Information Technology, Fire, Police, SPS, and DPW TIP projects. This clearly displays priorities and timelines across all functional areas.
- A dedicated Funding Summary FY27–FY31 sheet provides a consolidated overview of all
 projects from each department and serves as the main reference sheet. Within this summary
 sheet, there are embedded links to each individual project, allowing users to navigate
 directly to the corresponding departmental project page for details.

Affordability and Future Refinement

While the initial capital plan reflects the comprehensive needs of the Town, the **total projected cost exceeds what the Town can realistically afford** under current financial constraints. Recognizing this challenge, the Committee has committed to an ongoing, iterative planning process.

The Committee will continue to meet regularly over the coming months to:

- Reassess project priorities and sequencing
- Explore cost-saving strategies and alternative funding sources
- Adjust the scope and timing of proposed projects to ensure fiscal sustainability

The goal is to develop a balanced and affordable capital plan that addresses the most critical needs of the community and can be presented for consideration in FY27. This approach underscores the

Town's commitment to responsible long-term financial planning while maintaining essential infrastructure and services.

Next Steps

- 1. **Refinement:** Align the capital plan with available funding resources.
- 2. **Funding Strategy:** Finalize approaches to meet both short- and long-term capital needs.
- 3. **FY27 Capital Request:** Prepare and present for approval to the Select Board, Finance Committee, and CIAC.
- 4. **Ongoing Oversight:** Commit to annual reviews and updates to ensure the plan remains current and responsive.

Conclusion

The **15-Year Capital Plan** is a proactive, data-driven approach that ensures responsible stewardship of public assets while promoting transparency and community trust. Your feedback and guidance will be instrumental in finalizing the FY27 Capital Request and advancing the Town's long-term priorities. Staff looks forward to presenting this plan at the October 22nd Select Board meeting.
